An Important Announcement

Covid-19 has hit home at St. Peter and your leaders are responding in thoughtful and helpful ways. Here is what we know for certain:

Several participants in an event held on New Year's Eve have tested positive for and/or developed symptoms of Covid-19. In some cases, a family member has also contracted the virus. None of these persons were in worship on Sunday, January 3, and the last time any of these persons were in contact with other St. Peter members was on Wednesday, Dec. 30, when a family member was at a committee meeting where social distancing and other measures were followed.

Because of this, I and the elders in consultation with other congregation leaders have decided the following:

- 1) **Christmas "undecorating"** will continue as planned but social distancing measures, including wearing masks must be observed by everyone in attendance.
- 2) The **Call Committee** meeting schedule for Saturday will be rescheduled.
- 3) In-person worship for **Sunday**, **January 10**, will continue as planned.
- 3) We **Elders** and **Church Council** meetings on Tuesday, January 12, will be held as scheduled.
- 4) Mask wearing is **required** for every person in attendance at each event until at least Sunday, January 17. As always, we request that everyone wear a mask and observe social distancing, but **for the events in the coming week they will be required.**

However, if you have underlying health issues please do not join us in person for these events. As always, you are encouraged to join us online for the 9am service this Sunday.

Finally, please pray for those who have been directly impacted by this virus, most especially those of the St. Peter family who are ill. The first members of our congregation who are healthcare workers are receiving the first doses of the vaccine and we look forward to the time when more of our congregational family will be able to receive the same.


