Invocation

Confession and Absolution

P: Lord Jesus, we praise You for this opportunity to celebrate Your birth among us. Yet we must confess to You that much of the newness has worn off. The angel's message has grown cold in our darkened hearts, and Your birth has become more of a sentimental tradition for us to observe rather than the life-changing reality into which You invite us to participate by faith.

C: **And Lord, we are hurting because of this. Our hearts feel empty and alone. Our spirits remain restless and unsatisfied despite our abundance of possessions. Our souls are weighed down by nagging guilt, feelings of inadequacy, and haunting fears. Lord, we need to be assured of Your love. We need to know Your forgiveness. We need to experience the peace, the power, and the joy of Your presence, the Light that shines in the darkness of our lives.**

(Silence for personal reflection)

P: God has heard our prayer and He has answered it with the same great message He's been giving for over 2000 years: "Unto you has been born a Savior; He is Christ the Lord." Dear friends, this was not just His message to the shepherds then; it is God's message to us here, now, tonight. Come let us celebrate His joy and forgiveness anew, in Jesus' powerful Name.

C: Amen!

P: Beloved in Christ, let us rejoice again this year to hear the message of the Son of God and by the Holy Spirit come to the manger to behold the Light of the World.

C: The Light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

P: To us a Child is born, to us a Savior is given. He is Christ the Lord and He has forgiven all our sins. I announce His forgiveness to you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

First Reading, Isaiah 52:7-10

How beautiful upon the mountains
are the feet of him who brings good news,
who publishes peace, who brings good news of happiness,
who publishes salvation,
who says to Zion, "Your God reigns."

Second Reading, Luke 2:1-20

In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. ² This was the first registration when^[a] Quirinius was governor of Syria. ³ And all went to be registered, each to his own town. ⁴ And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the town of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, ⁵ to be registered with Mary, his betrothed,^[b] who was with child. ⁶ And while they were there, the time came for her to give birth. ⁷ And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths and laid him in a manger, because there was

no place for them in the inn.^[c]

⁸ And in the same region there were shepherds out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. ⁹ And an angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were filled with great fear. ¹⁰ And the angel said to them, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. ¹¹ For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. ¹² And this will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger." ¹³ And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying, ¹⁴ "Glory to God in the highest,

and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased!"^[d]

¹⁵ When the angels went away from them into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go over to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has made known to us." ¹⁶ And they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in a manger. ¹⁷ And when they saw it, they made known the saying that had been told them concerning this child. ¹⁸ And all who heard it wondered at what the shepherds told them. ¹⁹ But Mary treasured up all these things, pondering them in her heart. ²⁰ And the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.

Gospel Reading, John 1:1-14

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He was in the beginning with God. ³ All things were made through him, and without him was not any thing made that was made. ⁴ In him was life,^[a] and the life was the light of men. ⁵ The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

⁶ There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. ⁷ He came as a witness, to bear witness about the light, that all might believe through him. ⁸ He was not the light, but came to bear witness about the light.

⁹ The true light, which gives light to everyone, was coming into the world. ¹⁰ He was in the world, and the world was made through him, yet the world did not know him. ¹¹ He came to his own,^[b] and his own people^[c] did not receive him. ¹² But to all who did receive him, who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God, ¹³ who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God.

¹⁴ And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son^[d] from the Father, full of grace and truth.
