Maundy Thursday The Last Supper: A Place of Forgiveness

Welcome

The forty days of Lent now draw to a close in the three great days of Holy Week, **the Triduum**: Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. Often treated as one long service, these three days place our Lord's Passion at the center of our lives. We go home to rest and rise to labor, only to return and find that our Lord continues to labor for us. This one long service traces the days of our Lord's Passion, when He labored in love and offered His life for the forgiveness of our sin.

This evening, we gather to remember our Lord's celebration of Passover, His institution of the Lord's Supper. When faced with betrayal, Jesus remained faithful to His Father's mission. He prepared the Passover table, creating a place of forgiveness for His disciples. This evening, He opens that place of forgiveness for you.

Meditate now on the wondrous love of your Savior, who in the face of certain sin offered His life to be the certainty of your salvation.

Before we approach His table, let us make humble confession, plead for the forgiveness of Christ's blood, and, by the aid of the Spirit, seek to amend our sinful lives.

I confess to God Almighty, before the whole company of heaven and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have sinned in thought, word, and deed by my fault, by my own fault, by my own most grievous fault; wherefore I pray God Almighty to have mercy on me, forgive me all my sins, and bring me to everlasting life. Amen.

The Holy Gospel, Luke 22:7-23

Then came the day of Unleavened Bread, on which the Passover lamb had to be sacrificed. ⁸So Jesus sent Peter and John, saying, "Go and prepare the Passover for us, that we may eat it." ⁹They said to Him, "Where will You have us prepare it?" ¹⁰He said to them, "Behold, when you have entered the city, a man carrying a jar of water will meet you. Follow him into the house that he enters ¹¹and tell the master of the house, 'The Teacher says to you, Where is the guest room, where I may eat the Passover with My disciples?' ¹²And he will show you a large upper room furnished; prepare it there." ¹³And they went and found it just as He had told them, and they prepared the Passover.

¹⁴And when the hour came, He reclined at table, and the apostles with Him. ¹⁵And He said to them, "I have earnestly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer. ¹⁶For I tell you I will not eat it until it is fulfilled in the kingdom of God." ¹⁷And He took a cup, and when He had given thanks He said, "Take this, and divide it among yourselves. ¹⁸For I tell you that from now on I will not drink of the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes." ¹⁹And He took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to them, saying, "This is My body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of Me." ²⁰And likewise the cup after they had eaten, saying, "This cup that is poured out for you is the new covenant in My blood. ²¹But behold, the hand of him who betrays Me is with Me on the table. ²²For the Son of Man goes as it has been determined, but woe to that man by whom He is betrayed!" ²³And they began to question one another, which of them it could be who was going to do this. The Word of Our Lord

This do in remembrance of Me." In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying: "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in My +I+ blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."

As often as you eat of this bread and drink of this cup you proclaim the Lord's death until He comes.

St Peter's Communion Statement

The Lord's Supper is a special gift given by Jesus Christ to all baptized believers in the community of faith. In preparing for the Lord's Supper, we are to reflect upon the following questions:

1. Do I believe that I am a sinner in need of God's forgiveness?

2. Do I believe that, within this Sacrament, the bread and wine are Christ's true body and blood for the forgiveness of sins?

3. Do I promise, with the help of the Holy Spirit, to amend my sinful life?

4. Do I confess and believe the same doctrines of faith as the church body with which I am about to commune?

If you are having difficulty in answering "yes" to any of the above questions, please follow the guide of Scripture and refrain from taking communion today. Our Pastor would be glad to visit with you after the

service to answer any questions you may have about our Communion practice. If you require a gluten free wafer, please signal to Pastor by holding up your index finger in front of you. Non-alcoholic white grape juice is available in the center of the tray, for those with alcohol sensitivities.

Post-Communion Prayer

The Stripping of the Altar

For the Stripping of the Altar, members of the Altar Guild (or other congregational members) come forward wearing white gloves. The minister reads the following explanations to the congregation as each item is being removed.

- **Flowers and flower vases are the first items to be removed.** Plants represent life, New life springing forth. During the Passion and suffering of Christ, life receded and was stripped from Him. It is in recognition of these events that the flowers and vases are taken from our presence.
- **The candles are extinguished and removed.** Candles represent the "Light of the World." Jesus said, "I Am the light of the World." In recognition of the darkness following the death of Jesus on the cross, the candles are removed from our presence.
- **The Offerings** that have been placed on the Altar are removed. Our offerings are one manner by which we serve God and others. They represent the greatest offering that has ever been made—the offering of God's only Son, given unto death. Just as the body of Christ, which had been offered for our Salvation, was removed from the cross and removed from sight, our offerings are removed from our presence.
- **The Missal stand is removed.** The Missal contains all of the instructions and texts that guide our worship services, our readings, the songs of praise we sing. During Jesus' suffering, the songs of joy and thankfulness are not heard. Just as these songs are removed from our own lips, so, too, the Missal stand and book are removed from our presence.
- **The Communion Ware is removed.** Jesus' Body and Blood, have been sacrificed for us and are given to us with, in, and under the form of the bread and wine. Just as He was removed from us in the grave, so, too, the elements and the vessels of the Holy Eucharist are removed from our presence.

- **The Altar itself is in the form of a Table.** This is the place where our Lord Jesus Christ serves us as both host and meal at His banquet feast. The Altar is dressed in fine linens, coverings and paraments, fitting and deserving of such a Holy Meal, and in the presence of the King of Kings. And just as Jesus' body was stripped of its coverings, so we, too, strip the coverings from this Altar.
- **Finally, The Paschal candle,** which has remained lighted throughout this part of our worship service, is carried to the back of the sanctuary, there is no benediction,... there is no postlude, no closing hymn,... because the service is not over.
